

PE & Sport Premium: Isham CE Primary

The Government provides additional funding to improve provision of Physical Education (P.E.) and Sport in Primary Schools. This funding – provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of P.E. and Sport in Schools. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of P.E. and Sport but have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Funding received

2016/2017 – we received £8847

2017/2018 – we received £17040

How we (more than) spent our money in 16/17:

- School Sports Partnership
- Y3/4 Swimming and transport
- Transport to school games organised across the area, in and outside of the Sports Partnership
- Specialist P.E. Coaching in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2
- Training of staff
- Year 5/6 Young Leader training
- Regular inter-School sporting fixtures and participation in local leagues

In 2017/2018, we intend to spend it on the above, and also:

- Swimming teacher training for KS2 staff (likely to need to extend swimming to Y5 in 18/19)
- Possible increased swimming hours (due to low standard in current Y3)
- Re-launching Golden Mile
- Part funding of Sports Specialist HLTA in school
- Developing 'Active Maths'

Outcomes & Impact 2016/17

- High numbers of children taking part in Level 2 and 3 Sport
- Increased specialist P.E. Teaching to include KS1
- Increased inter-school competitions in KS1
- Participation in many Inclusion Sports Tournaments
- Continued success in Level 2 competitions leading to Level 3 participation
- All children engaged in at least 2 hrs quality sport – and more than 70% KS2 engaged in 4hrs + sport each week
- All our children have had opportunity to participate in Level 1 Sport, experiencing a range of multi-skilled approaches to a wide variety of

sports and competitions within the structure of their PE lessons and in external events such as the cross country and the dance festival.

- Many children have had the chance to participate in Level 2 sports, against other local schools in the Kettering District as this year we have often entered two and three teams into tournaments.
- Four sports teams participated in Level 3 sport – at County level; competing against the five other sports partnerships in the county (Wellingborough, Northampton, Corby, Daventry & East Northants, Oundle & Thrapston).

As usual, Isham have secured huge success locally, within the district and countywide.

Undoubtedly the skills learnt in our PE lessons and through our Sport curriculum – determination, dedication, skill, respect, effort, teamwork, sportsmanship continue to impact positively on our children's academic ability – as is verified by our strong academic achievement in 2017
